CARIRI'S RELATIONSHIP WITH WAITRO Hans Erich Schulz CEO Cariri

A defining feature of CARIRI's journey as a Research and Technology Organization (RTO) is its relationship with the World Association of Industrial and Technological Research Organizations (WAITRO). The Institute is a founding member of WAITRO which is the largest global network of RTOs.

WAITRO has more than 100 full and associate members in over fifty (50) countries across the globe. The membership base spans Europe, Asia and the Pacific, Latin America and the Caribbean, Middle East and North Africa, and Sub-Saharan Africa. The Organization provides a wide range of services and programs to foster R&D capacity building and facilitate the transfer of technologies around the globe.

Membership in WAITRO affords CARIRI access to high level technical expertise, transfer of technology/know-how and opportunities to participate in bidding for consultancy assignments from international funding/developmental agencies under consortium arrangements.

The Institute has benefited immensely over the years from membership in WAITRO, as follows:

1. RTO Capacity Building via Training and Consultancy Support in a number of areas, including specialized technical/operational areas and various aspects of management of RTOs.

CARIRI has benefitted over the years from capacity building in areas such as RTO Management, Food Technology, Industrial Materials (Metallurgy), Analytical Chemistry and Microbiology, and ICT.

This has been achieved through participation in training programmes conducted and sponsored by WAITRO, and engaging Consultancy support from key member organizations such as the Shriram Institute for Industrial Research (SRI) and National Metallurgical Laboratories (NML), India; Standards and Industrial Research Institute of Malaysia (SIRIM Berhad); Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), South Africa; and the Danish Technological Institute (DTI).

2. Joint bidding for the undertaking of project initiatives within the framework of consortium type arrangements; which involves the pooling of skills/resources of a number of RTOs to bid for the undertaking of projects sponsored by international/regional funding/developmental agencies. Developmental project initiatives could also be put forward to WAITRO for consideration under competitive funding arrangements.

Other areas of interest to CARIRI, in terms of benefiting from membership in WAITRO are as follows:

Joint undertaking of applied research projects

This is an area that CARIRI has not exploited, though there is potential for so doing. Opportunities in this area could be identified through networking and utilization of SAIRA, WAITRO's Open Innovation Platform for sustainable development.

Sustainability, Access, Innovation, Research and Application (SAIRA)

SAIRA is an open innovation hub that is designed to foster/accelerate collaboration among RTOs, Academia, Governments, Civil Society and the Private Sector with the aim of achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). It is imperative that all members thoroughly familiarize themselves with SAIRA and seek to fully exploit the wealth of opportunities that it affords.

assessment, project formulation and management, and collaboration with public and private entities and sectoral networks.


The National Institute for Technical and Vocational Training - INFOTEP of the Dominican Republic, focused on business development, technical assistance for companies, innovation management, and dual training.
